



municipal golf course, it could be \$300,000 in revenue. Alderman Medford supports the City obtaining a liquor license.

The park has been developed under the hotel and motel tax. A single tournament could generate well over \$300,000 in economical impact. These people spend a night or two, eat, and purchase gas and supplies. OPRD has teams on hold due to the fact that they want to know if alcohol is going to be allowed. The first question is: Do we sell alcohol at the Sport Park, yes or no? If the answer is "No," then we need to look at all of our parks and remove the option for patrons to carry non glass alcohol into all parks. If the answer is "Yes," we have three options:

- City Parks & Recreation Department obtains liquor license
- City obtains a special event liquor license after Council approval for those adult tournaments that request this service and allow the leagues to carry alcohol into the Sport Park.
- City sends out a RFP for possible contracted vendors to sell alcohol during adult leagues and tournaments.

Committee Vote:

If sold, should it be outsourced? 2 For and 2 Against.
