Subject: Ordinance Establishing Drury Development Business District (Final)

List of committees that have reviewed: Finance and Administration

Background: The amendment is a final vote once the public hearings were complete. The basic plan is unchanged from the draft. Drury has owned the property at the corner of I-64 Exit 16 and Greenmount Road for the past five years. They began the development of this property last fall, and asked for assistance with a SSA, which the city is providing. During the site preparation, a mine shaft was discovered running directly under the new seven-story hotel. Fixing this problem was an additional \$1,000,000. As an incentive to complete this project in a timely fashion, the city offered to establish a special business district that would allow Drury to charge an additional 1% on the hotel tax collected by the state. This 1%, over the next 23 years, should allow Drury to recover a substantial portion of the mine subsidence cost and make this a financially viable project. This is no cost to the City of O'Fallon

Legal Considerations, if any: Attorney Kurt Froehlich recommends one final vote to assure all actions are in compliance with state law. His costs are covered by an administrative fee collected by the city to manage the district.

Budget Impact: This project is no cost or liability to the city.

Staff recommendation: Staff recommends final Council approval for this ordinance.
