**AN ORDINANCE DESIGNATING
AS A LOCAL HISTORIC
LANDMARK 106 E MONROE
STREET IN O’FALLON, ILLINOIS,
PURSUANT TO THE
REQUIREMENTS OF CHAPTER
151 OF THE O’FALLON CODE OF
ORDINANCES
(Parcel number 04-29.0-102-010, also
known as the Cora Porter Home)**

WHEREAS, Chapter 151 of the City of O’Fallon Code of Ordinances provides rules and parameters for designating historic structures and districts; and

WHEREAS, Chapter 151 gives the commission responsibility for recommending to the City Council those structures or districts that have significant local, state or national historical or architectural importance; and

WHEREAS, the Commission has received and accepted an application from Sue and Ted Peterson, owners of the structure located at 106 East Monroe Street, commonly known as the Cora Porter Home, for designation as a local historic landmark; and

WHEREAS, the Commission held a public hearing pursuant to the requirements of Chapter 151 on March 7, 2006 to consider the designation of the home located at 106 E Monroe Street as a local historic landmark; and

WHEREAS, the Commission unanimously recommends to the City Council that the structure located at 106 E Monroe Street in the City of O’Fallon represents a structure that a) has significance or value for identification with a person who significantly contributed to the development of the community, county, state or nation; b) has elements of design, detailing, materials or craftsmanship that renders it architecturally significant or innovative; and c) represents a sense of time and place unique to the City.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF O’FALLON, ST. CLAIR COUNTY, ILLINOIS AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Findings. Based upon the City Council’s review of the application and the testimony giving at the public hearing, and having made itself familiar with the project, the council makes the following affirmative determinations: the structure located at 106 E Monroe Street a) has significance or value for identification with a person who significantly contributed to the development of the community,

county, state or nation; b) has elements of design, detailing, materials or craftsmanship that renders it architecturally significant or innovative; and c) represents a sense of time and place unique to the City.

Section 2. Adoption. That the home located at 106 E Monroe Street, known as the Cora Porter Home, shall hereafter be designated as a landmark of local historical significance pursuant to the provision of Chapter 151.

Section 3. Filing. That the City Clerk be and is hereby directed to file with the Recorder of deeds of St. Clair County, Illinois a copy of this ordinance.

Section 4. Passage. Upon its passage and approval, this ordinance shall be in full force and effect ten (10) days after its publication in pamphlet form as required by law.
