WITNESSETH

WHEREAS, pursuant to Article VII, Section 10 of the Constitution of the State of Illinois of 1970, together with the powers and authority granted to the parties under the Intergovernmental Cooperation Act (5 ILCS 220/1 et seq.), the parties hereto have the authority to enter into this Police Department Dispatch Intergovernmental Agreement for the proper purposes of their respective governments, and specifically to facilitate the operation and staffing necessary for Fairview Heights' police dispatch services; and

WHEREAS, Fairview Heights and O'Fallon desire to enter into an intergovernmental agreement requiring O'Fallon to provide necessary 911 certified and trained dispatch staff, as needed by Fairview Heights, from time to time, to provide its police department dispatch services, at the expense of Fairview Heights as more fully set forth herein.

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual promises, terms, covenants, and conditions set forth herein, the parties agree as follows:

1. **Purpose.** This Agreement formalizes relationships between the participating entities in order to insure that Fairview Heights maintains adequate personnel necessary to provide police dispatch services; and contemplates that O'Fallon will, from time to time, assist Fairview Heights in providing it necessary staff to provide said services. This program shall be referred to as the "Police Dispatcher on Loan Program" or "PDLP".

2. Structure.

- A. Composition. The PDLP will initially consist of one (1) part-time dispatch employee, with 911 certification and training completion, selected by O'Fallon City Police Department pursuant to existing requirements as set forth by O'Fallon City Police Department and Fairview Heights City Police Department Rules and Regulations, who shall work for Fairview Heights no more than twenty-eight (28) hours in any seven (7) day period.
- **B.** Supervision. On a day-to-day basis the PDLP employee will follow the operational procedures and scheduling directives of the Fairview Heights City Police Department. For all other purposes, the employee assigned to Fairview Heights shall be considered to be an employee of O'Fallon and shall be subject to its control, supervision and terms and conditions of employment.

- C. Relationship of Parties. The PDLP dispatch employee shall have the status of an independent contractor to Fairview Heights for purposes of this Agreement. The assigned employee will be subject to current procedures in effect for certified 911 dispatch employees, including, but not limited to, attendance at all authorized training. This Agreement is not intended to and will not constitute, create, give rise to, or otherwise recognize a joint venture, partnership, or formal business association or organization of any kind between the parties, and the rights and obligations of the parties shall be only those expressly set forth in this Agreement. The parties agree that no person supplied by O'Fallon to accomplish the goals of this Agreement is a Fairview Heights employee for any purpose and that no rights under the Fairview Heights City employment, retirement, or personnel rules accrue to such person.
- 3. Selection. When a PDLP position becomes available, Fairview Heights will notify O'Fallon of the vacancy and it will be staffed by O'Fallon according to the requirements and guidelines contained in this Agreement.
- 4. Reimbursement/Compensation. As sole reimbursement/compensation for the dispatch services provided under this Agreement, Fairview Heights shall pay to O'Fallon an amount equivalent to the same part-time pro rata share of the cost of the salary and benefits otherwise payable to a full-time dispatch employee of O'Fallon, which amount shall be determined by O'Fallon and paid by Fairview Heights quarterly, commencing three (3) months after date of assignment.
- 5. Term of the Agreement/Termination. This Agreement shall continue unless cancelled by either party with thirty (30) days written notice.
- 6. Strict Compliance. No failure by either party to insist upon the strict performance of any covenant, term or condition of this Agreement, or to exercise any right or remedy upon a breach thereof, shall constitute a waiver of any such breach or any subsequent breach of such covenant, term or condition. No waiver of any breach shall affect or alter this Agreement, but each and every covenant, term and condition of this Agreement shall continue in full force and effect.
- 7. Notice. All notices, requests, approvals, demands and other communications required or permitted to be given under this Agreement shall be in writing and shall be deemed to have been duly given and to be effective when delivered personally (including delivery by express or courier service) or, if mailed, three (3) business days after being deposited in the United States mail as registered or certified matter, postage prepaid, return receipt requested, addressed as follows or to such other address as either party may designate by notice to the other party in accordance with this Paragraph 7:

- **8.** Amendments. Neither this Agreement nor any term or provision hereof may be changed, waived, discharged or terminated, except by an instrument in writing signed by both of the parties hereto.
- **9.** Captions. The captions to this Agreement are for convenience of reference only and in no way define or limit the scope or intent of this Agreement.
- 10. Controlling Law. This Agreement shall be interpreted and construed in accordance with the laws of the State of Illinois.
- 11. Severability. If, for any reason, any clause or provision of this Agreement, or the application of any clause to a particular context or to a particular situation, circumstance or person, should be held unenforceable, invalid or in violation of law by any court or other tribunal, the application of such clause or provision in other contexts or to other situations, circumstances or persons shall not be affected thereby, and the remaining clauses and provisions hereof shall remain in full force and effect.
- 12. Entire Agreement. This Agreement constitutes the entire agreement between the parties hereto with respect to the subject matter hereof and any and all prior correspondence, conversations or memoranda are merged herein.
- 13. Nonexclusive Agreement. This Agreement is independent of, and in addition to, any other contracts or mutual agreements between the parties and to any other contracts or agreements to which Fairview Heights and O'Fallon, or either of them is a party.

CITY OF O'FALLON, ILLINOIS ORDINANCE NO. ______, AMENDING CHAPTER 77, SCHEDULE VI, TRUCK ROUTES OF THE CITY CODE OF ORDINANCES

WHEREAS, Chapter 77 of the City's Code of Ordinances provides for traffic schedules; and

WHEREAS, it has been determined that Schedule VI, Truck Routes, is in need of revision; and

WHEREAS, the corporate authorities deem it necessary, proper and in the best interest of the City to amend Chapter 77 of the City Code of Ordinances in order to promote the health, safety and general welfare of the residents of the City of O'Fallon.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF O'FALLON, ST. CLAIR COUNTY, ILLINOIS AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. The forgoing recitals are incorporated herein as findings of the City Council.

Section 2. Chapter 77, Schedule VI is repealed in its entirety and replaced with the following.

Schedule VI. PREFERRED TRUCK ROUTES.

(A) In order to establish a preferred truck route system within the City, the following streets shall be designated, by proper sign approved by the Illinois Department of Transportation to allow the same rights and privileges as non-designated state highways regarding weight, width, and length as is set forth in ILCS Ch. 625, Act 5 §§ 15-102, 15-107, and 15-111, commonly referred to as the Illinois Vehicle Code.

(B) The streets to be designated as City preferred truck routes are:

Chapter 75:

Chapter 75 of the City Code of Ordinances governs weight and size limitations for motor vehicles operating within the City of O'Fallon. The Code of Ordinances does not provide for a penalty for any person operating a motor vehicle in the City of O'Fallon while exceeding the gross weight and size limits as established by the City Ordinance. Currently all enforcement action is enforced by citation through the State of Illinois. Therefore, the corporate authorities deem it necessary, proper and in the best interest of the City to amend Chapter 75 of the City Code of Ordinances to permit enforcement of violations as an ordinance violation.

CITY OF O'FALLON, ILLINOIS ORDINANCE NO. ______, AMENDING CHAPTER 75, REGARDING WEIGHT LOAD, PERMITS AND PENALITES OF THE CITY CODE OF ORDINANCES

WHEREAS, the City of O'Fallon ("City") is a Home Rule Municipal Corporation pursuant to Section 6 of Article VII of the Constitution of the State of Illinois; and

WHEREAS, the City is empowered through the Illinois Vehicle Code, 625 ILCS 5/15-316 et. seq. and its police powers to impose weight and size limitations for motor vehicles and prohibit the operations of motor vehicles on designated roads within its boundaries to protect the lives, public health, morals and general welfare of its residents, including but not limited to, preserving the roadway integrity and otherwise mitigate losses caused by road deterioration and to minimize traffic hazards; and

WHEREAS, Chapter 75 of the City Code of Ordinances governs weight and size limitations for motor vehicles operating within the City of O'Fallon; and

WHEREAS, Chapter 75 of the City Code of Ordinances does not provide for a penalty for any person operating a motor vehicle in the City of O'Fallon while exceeding the gross weight and size limits as established by City Ordinance; and

WHEREAS, Chapter 75 of the City Code of Ordinances does not provide for a penalty for any person who fails to obtain or alters a required overweight or oversize permit.

WHEREAS, the corporate authorities have determined that fines imposed in connection with the regulation of weight and load limits on motor vehicles using City roads and streets, are necessary and proper for the maintenance, repair and replacement of streets and roads when it is required.

WHEREAS, the corporate authorities deem it necessary, proper and in the best interest of the City to amend Chapter 75 of the City Code of Ordinances in order to promote the health, safety and general welfare of the residents of the City; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF O'FALLON, ST. CLAIR COUNTY, ILLINOIS AS FOLLOWS:

- **Section 1.** The forgoing recitals are incorporated herein as findings of the City Council.
- **Section 2.** Chapter 75, Section 75.15 <u>SCOPE AND EFFECT OF SIZE, WEIGHT AND LOAD REGULATIONS</u> of the O'Fallon Code of Ordinances is hereby amended by way of addition of the following.
- (E) It shall be unlawful for any driver of a vehicle to refuse to stop and submit his vehicle and load to weighing after being directed to do so by an officer or move or cause the removal of the load or part of it prior to weighing. Any person convicted of such violation shall be fined in an amount not less than \$500.00 nor more than \$2,000.00.

(ILCS 625 5/15-112(g))

Section 3. Chapter 75, Section 75.21 <u>LIMITED LOAD STREETS</u>, of the O'Fallon Code of Ordinances is hereby amended by way of addition of the following.

In addition to other fees and fines contained in this Section, the owner or driver of the vehicle who pleads guilty or is found guilty of violating this Section, shall be fined Fifty and 00/100 Dollars (\$50.00) for any weight exceeding the posted limit up to the axel or gross weight limit allowed a vehicle as provided for in ILCS 625 5/15-111 and Seventy Five and 00/100 Dollars (\$75.00) per every 500 pounds or fraction thereof for any weight exceeding that which is provide for in ILCS 625 5/15-111.

- **Section 4.** Section 75.31 <u>PERMITS</u>, Section A is repealed in its entirety and replaced with the following.
- (A) A permit shall be required for the movement of any vehicle or combinations of vehicles that is non-divisible or is carrying a load that is non-divisible, while operating on roadways and bridges within the jurisdiction of the City which exceeds the following limits:
 - (1) Maximum weight specified in 625 ILCS 5/11-111;
 - (2) Maximum overall length specified in 625 ILCS 5/15-107;
 - (3) Maximum overall width specified in 625 ILCS 5/15-102;
 - (4) Maximum overall height specified in 625 ILCS5/15-103; Exempt from permits are the following:
 - (1) Fire departments vehicles;
 - (2) Those vehicles operating under an emergency declaration;
 - (3) City owned vehicles engaged in emergency utility repair;
 - (4) Equipment used for snow and ice removal, owned by any governmental body.

- (B) Permits shall be issued only in the name of a person, firm, business, or corporation that owns and operates the transporting vehicle or that operates the vehicle under a bona fide lease agreement.
- (C) Permits for vehicles that are both overweight and/or oversized are valid only a half hour before sunrise until a half hour after sunset, on any day which a permit issued by the Illinois Department of Transportation is valid.
 - (D) Permits are non-transferable and apply only to the permittee.
 - (E) The City may issue revisions to permits:
 - (1) To correct an error attributed to the City;
 - (2) To correct an error attributed to the applicant, discovered before the move;
 - (3) To adjust weights, dimension or routes as issued on the permit, before the move is made.
- (F) The permit, when issued, constitutes an agreement between the permittee and the City that the move described in the application will take place only as described. The permittee has the responsibility to report to the O'Fallon Police Department any inaccuracies or errors on the part of either the City or the permittee before starting any move. Undertaking the move is prima facie evidence of acceptance of the permit as issued and its terms.
- (G) The routing prescribed in the permit constitutes the sole extent of the authority granted by the permit for the use of roads under the jurisdiction of the City, and any vehicle and/or load found to be off route will be considered off route and without a permit. Permits shall be in the drivers possession at all times unless otherwise directed by the O'Fallon Police Department and presented upon demand to any and all police officers for the purpose of inspection.
- (H) Any vehicle(s) and/or load found to be divisible will render the permit null and void. The entire gross weight and axles weights of the vehicles(s) with the load are subject to legal weights. It is the duty of the applicant to verify the non-divisibility of the vehicle(s) before making application for the permit. The permit application itself is prima facie evidence that that applicant confirmed the vehicle(s) and/or load were non-divisible.
- (I) If required, arrangement shall be made by the permittee to have the proper utilities notified, property moved, bridge or highway analysis performed and completed in advance of any permit movement.

- (J) All movements under the permit shall be made in accordance with all applicable federal, State and local laws, ordinances, rules and regulations.
- (K) Permits are null and void if altered for the purpose of deception. The permits issued under this section constitute the grant of privilege by the City and may be denied or suspended for such reasons as the City may deem rationally related to its governmental interests including, but not limited to:
 - (1) A permittee knowingly provided incorrect information in an application for a permit;
 - (2) A permittee, its agents, or employees operating on a permit which has been altered for purposes of deception;
 - (3) Non-compliance by permittee, its agents or employees with Federal, State, or local ordinances pertaining to the transport of goods or operation of a vehicle engaged in the transport of goods;
 - (4) Moving on City streets without a valid permit as required under this section.
 - (L) All single-trip or round-trip permits are limited to movements on assigned routes only.
- (M) All quarterly or annual overweight permits are restricted to the following maximum limitations and routing:
 - (1) 12 ft. in width
 - (2) 13 ft. 6 in. in height
 - (3) 115 ft. in length
 - (4) May not move across bridges or structures that are posted or listed as such on the City truck route map.
 - (5) May not move on a "no-truck" route that is posted or listed as such on the City truck route map, without written permission from a member of the O'Fallon Police Department.
 - (6) May not use any City street as a cut-thru to avoid using a State, Country, or Township highway.

These permits are subject to all standards of application set forth in § 75.32, except that the load may be interchanged provided none of the above listed maximum weight and size dimensions are exceeded. Quarterly and annual permits shall list the registration number and state for the power unit, and vehicle identification number

(VIN). The serial number of the power unit, and/or owner applied number shall also be listed, if applicable.

Any violation of these terms will render the permit null and void, and subject the driver, firm, business, or corporation that owns the vehicle to legal weight and dimension laws. The arresting police officer will immediately confiscate the permit.

Section 5. Chapter 75, Section 75.34 <u>BONDS</u>, <u>INDEMNIFICATION AND INSURANCE</u> is repealed in its entirety and replaced with the following.

- (A) The permittee shall assume total liability for any and all damages to streets, bridges, City owned appurtenances and private or public property while engaged in a permit move. The measure of liability shall be the cost of repairing the damaged street or roadway improvements or facility partially damaged or the depreciated replacement cost of said roadway improvement or facility damaged beyond repair together with all other expenses incurred by the authorities in control of said street or roadway improvements in providing a temporary detour, including a temporary structure, to serve the needs of traffic during the period of repair or replacement of the damaged roadway improvement or street.
- (B) The permittee shall indemnify and hold harmless the City and members of the Police Department from any costs, judgments or settlements, including attorneys' fees, arising from physical injuries, including loss of life, or damage to or loss of property related to acts or omissions by permittee, its officers, agents, or employees pursuant to the permit.
- (C) Upon application for a permit each applicant shall provide evidence of a valid comprehensive general liability insurance police, with an insurance company approved by the City, for protection against personal injury or property damage in the amount of One Million and 00/100 Dollars (\$1,000,000.00) per occurrence. The City shall be listed as a certificate holder on the policy.
- (D) Any person driving any motor vehicle upon any street within the O'Fallon Corporate limits without a permit as required by Section 75.31, as well as the driver's employer, shall be liable for any damage which said street or appurtenant roadway improvements may sustain as a result of any operation, driving or moving of such

vehicle exceeding the maximum weight specified in this Ordinance. The measure of damage shall be as defined in Sub-Section (A) above.

Section 6. Section 75.37 is hereby amended by way of addition of the following. Section 75.37. OVERWEIGHT ON REGISTRATION

If a vehicle and load are operated in the State of Illinois and the appropriate fees and taxes have not been paid or the vehicle and load exceed the registered gross weight for which the required fees and taxes have been paid by 2001 pounds or more, the operator or owner shall be fined as provided in the Illinois Vehicle Code, Section 15-113 (ILCS 625 5/15-113). However, an owner or operator shall not be subject to arrest under this subsection for any weight in excess of eighty thousand (80,000) pounds. Further, no fine shall exceed the actual cost of what the appropriate registration for that vehicle and load should have been as established in subsection (a) of Section 3-815 of the Illinois Vehicle Code (ILCS 625 5/3-815(a)) regardless of the route traveled. For the purposes of this Section, "Appropriate registration" means the full annual cost of the required registration and its associated fees.

(ILCS 625 5/3-401(d)(2))

Section 7. Chapter 75, is amended by way of addition of the following. Section 75.38 PENALTY FOR VIOLATIONS.

- (A) Any person charged with the violation of Section 75.15(A), herein, may be prosecuted for such violation. Any person who pleads guilty or is found guilty of violating Section 75.15(A), shall be fined according to the Illinois Vehicle Code Section 15-113 (ILCS 625 5/15-113).
- (B) A permittee, its officers, agents or employees, charged with violation of Section 75.31(K) herein, maybe prosecuted for such violation. Any person found guilty of moving an over oversized or overweight vehicle or load on a highway under a fraudulent permit or permit altered for purposes of deception shall be subject to a fine of not less than One Thousand and 00/100 Dollars (\$1,000.00) nor more than Two Thousand Five Hundred and 00/100 Dollars (\$2,500.00).

The fines in this sub-section shall be in addition to any other fees or fines contained in this Ordinance or under statutory law.

(C) Whenever any vehicle is operated or movement made in violation of a permit issued in accordance with Section 15-301 of the Illinois Vehicle Code (ILCS 625 5/15-301, the person or entity to whom such permit was granted or the driver of such vehicle, but not both, may be prosecuted for such violation as stated in this subsection (C). Any person, firm or corporation convicted of such violation shall be guilty of a petty offense and shall be fined for the first offense, not less than Fifty and 00/100 Dollars (\$50.00) nor more than Two Hundred and 00/100 Dollars (\$200.00) and, for the second offense by the same person, firm or corporation within a period of one (1) year, not less than Two Hundred and 00/100 Dollars (\$200.00) nor more than Three Hundred and 00/100 Dollars (\$300.00) and, for the third (3rd) offense by the same person, firm or corporation within a period of one (1) year after the date of the first offense, not less than Three Hundred and 00/100 Dollars (\$300.00) nor more than Five Hundred and 00/100 Dollars (\$500.00).

(ILCS 625 5/15-301(j))

The fines in this sub-section shall be in addition to any other fees or fines contained in this Ordinance or under statutory law.

(D) Whenever any vehicle is operated in violation of the provisions of a permit issued under the provisions of Section 15-301 (ILCS 625 5/15-301) of the Illinois Vehicle Code by operating with axle weights in excess of those authorized in such permit, the person or entity to whom such permit was granted or the driver of such vehicle, but not both, may be prosecuted for such violation as stated in this sub-section (D). Any person, firm or corporation convicted of such violation shall be fined in an amount not less than two (2) cents nor more than five (5) cents per pound for each pound of excess weight on such axle or tandem axle in excess of the weight authorized in the permit when the excess is one thousand (1,000) pounds or less; not less than five (5) cents nor more than ten (10) cents per pound for each pound of excess weight when the excess exceeds one thousand (1,000) pounds and is two thousand (2,000) pounds or less; not less than ten (10) cents nor more than fifteen (15) cents per pound for each pound of excess weight when the excess exceeds two

thousand (2,000) pounds and is three thousand (3,000) pounds or less; and not less than fifteen (15) cents nor more than twenty (20) cents per pound for each pound of excess weight when the excess exceeds three thousand (3,000) pounds.

(ILCS 625 5/15-113.2)

The fines in this sub-section shall be in addition to any other fees or fines contained in this Ordinance or under statutory law.

(E) Whenever any vehicle is operated in violation of the provisions of a permit issued under the provisions of Section 75.37 of this Chapter by operating with the gross weight in excess of that authorized in such permit, the person or entity to whom such permit was granted or the driver of such vehicle, but not both, may be prosecuted for such violation as stated in this sub-section (E). Any person, firm or corporation convicted of such violation shall be fined in an amount not less than two (2) cents nor more than five (5) cents per pound for each pound of excess weight in excess of the gross weight authorized in the permit when the excess is one thousand (1,000) pounds or less; not less than four (4) cents nor more than seven (7) cents per pound for each pound of excess weight when the excess exceeds one thousand (1,000) pounds and is two thousand (2,000) pounds or less; not less than seven (7) cents nor more than ten (10) cents per pound for each pound of excess weight when the excess exceeds two thousand (2,000) pounds and is three thousand (3,000) pounds or less; not less than ten (10) cents nor more than fifteen (15) cents per pound for each pound of excess weight when the excess exceeds three thousand (3,000) pounds and is four thousand (4,000) pounds or less; not less than fifteen (15) cents nor more than twenty (20) cents per pound for each pound of excess weight when the excess exceeds four thousand (4,000) pounds and is five thousand (5,000) pounds or less; and not less than seventeen (17) cents nor more than twenty-five (25) cents per pound for each pound of excess weight when the excess exceeds five thousand (5,000) pounds.

(ILCS 625 5/15 113.3)

The fines in this sub-section shall be in addition to any other fees or fines contained in this Ordinance or under statutory law.

All other provisions of Chapter 75 of the City Code of Ordinances, not otherwise amended here in, shall remain in full force and effect.

CITY OF O'FALLON, ILLINOIS ORDINANCE NO. _____, AMENDING CHAPTER 70, GENERAL PROVISIONS ON WEIGHT IN THE CITY CODE OF ORDINANCES

WHEREAS, Chapter 70 of the City's Code of Ordinances provides definitions for the City's Traffic Code; and

WHEREAS, it is determined Chapter 70 needs to be supplemented as it relates to the trucking industry; and

WHEREAS, the corporate authorities deem it necessary, proper and in the best interest of the City to amend Chapter 70 of the City Code of Ordinances in order to promote the health, safety and general welfare of the residents of the City of O'Fallon.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF O'FALLON, ST. CLAIR COUNTY, ILLINOIS AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. The forgoing recitals are incorporated herein as findings of the City Council.

Section 2. Chapter 70, Section 70.001 <u>DEFINITIONS</u> is amended by way of addition of the following.

AXLE LOAD. The total load transmitted to the road by all wheels whose centers may be included between 2 parallel transverse vertical planes 40 inches apart extending across the full width of the vehicle.

(ILCS Ch. 625, Act 5, §1-105.6)

GROSS VEHICLE WEIGHT RATING (GVWR). The value specified by the manufacturer or manufacturers as the maximum load weight of a single vehicle. The GVWR of a combination of vehicles (commonly referred to as the "Gross Combination Weight Rating" or GCWR) is the specified by the manufacturer, GCWR is determined by adding the GVWR of the power unit and the total weight of the towed unit and any load on the unit.

(ILCS Ch. 625, Act 5, § 1-124.5)

SPECIAL MOBILE EQUIPMENT. Every vehicle not designed or used primarily for the transportation of persons or property and only incidentally operated or moved over a highway, including but not limited to: street sweepers, ditch digging apparatus, well boring apparatus and road construction and maintenance machinery such as asphalt spreaders, bituminous mixers, bucket loaders, tractors other than truck tractors, ditchers, leveling graders, finishing machines, motor graders, road rollers, scarifies, each moving carryalls and scrapers, power shovels and drag lines, and self-propelled cranes and earth moving equipment. The term does not include house trailers, dump trucks, truck mounted transit mixers, cranes or shovels, or other vehicles designed for the transportation of persons or property to which machinery has been attached.

(ILCS Ch. 625, Act 5, § 1-191)

<u>TANDEM AXLES.</u> Any 2 or more single axles whose centers are more than 40 inches and nor more than 96 inches apart, measured to the nearest inch between extreme axles in the series, except as provided in ILCS Ch. 625, Act 5, § 15-111 for special hauling vehicles.

(ILCS Ch. 625 Act 5, § 1-204.3)

All other provisions of Chapter 70 of the City Code of Ordinances, shall remain in full force and effect.

Background:

The purpose of this ordinance is to provide a fair and efficient method of determining the eligibility of an employee for the benefits enumerated under the Public Safety Employee Benefits Act (820 ILCS 320/1 et seq.) (PSEBA), through the process of an administrative hearing. All benefits provided employees pursuant to the Public Safety Employee Benefits Act (Act) will be consistent with the Act.

AN ORDINANCE ESTABLISHING AN ADMINISTRATIVE HEARING PROCEDURE TO DETERMINE ELIGIBILITY UNDER THE PUBLIC SAFETY EMPLOYEE BENEFITS ACT

WHEREAS, the City of O'Fallon, St. Clair County, Illinois, is a home rule unit and may exercise any power and perform any function pertaining to its government and affairs, including, but not limited to, the power to tax and incur debt; and

WHEREAS, The Mayor and City Council believe, and hereby declare, that it is in the best interests of the City to establish an administrative hearing procedure in order to determine eligibility under the Public Safety Employee Benefits Act (820 ILCS 320/1 et seq.); and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF O'FALLON, ST. CLAIR COUNTY, ILLINOIS AS FOLLOWS:

<u>Section 1</u>. That upon the effective date of this Ordinance, Chapter 32 of the City Code of Ordinances are hereby amended by adding section ____. Chapter 32, section ## shall hereafter be and read as follows:

ADMINISTRATIVE HEARING PROCEDURE TO DETERMINE ELEIGIBILITY UNDER THE PUBLIC SAFETY EMPLOYEE BENEFITS ACT

§ 32.70: PURPOSE:

The purpose of this chapter is to provide a fair and efficient method of determining the eligibility of an employee for the benefits enumerated under the Public Safety Employee Benefits Act (820 ILCS 320/1 et seq.) (PSEBA), through the process of an administrative hearing. All benefits provided employees pursuant to the Public Safety Employee Benefits Act (Act) will be consistent with the Act.

§ 32.71: APPLICATION FORM, MEDICAL INFORMATION AND AFFIDAVIT:

In conjunction with a request for PSEBA benefits, a public safety employee, or his/her representative, shall file a completed, notarized application for PSEBA benefits, relevant medical information and an affidavit for PSEBA coverage with the City Administrator. The application for PSEBA benefits shall include, but shall not be limited to, a fully detailed statement of the nature of the employee's claim giving full particulars thereof, i.e. date, time, place, nature of injury, and other factual circumstances surrounding the incident giving rise to said claim. The application shall also include a signed PSEBA medical authorization release and a signed PSEBA general information release. If the City Administrator decides that additional information is necessary in order to render a decision, he may schedule and informal meeting with the employee's representative.

Within twenty (20) days after receipt of the aforesaid PSEBA application, the City Administrator shall determine whether sufficient documentation has been presented to warrant approval of the requested PSEBA benefit. Should the City Administrator approve the PSEBA benefit, the City will grant the health insurance benefits consistent with PSEBA. The City Administrator shall issue a written decision which

shall be deemed a final administrative decision. Should the City Administrator deny the request for the PSEBA benefit, the City Administrator shall issue a written decision to that effect, and the PSEBA applicant shall have the right to request an administrative hearing which must be served on the City Administrator within thirty (30) days after the date of City Administrator's written decision of denial. A copy of the City Administrator's written decision shall be promptly served on the PSEBA applicant by certified mail. If a request for administrative hearing is made, the City Administrator will notify the applicant, by certified mail, of the date, time and location of the PSEBA administrative hearing. The employee must confirm the receipt of said notice and concur with the date set for the administrative hearing in writing within thirty (30) days after being served notice of the administrative hearing. If the employee fails, or chooses not to confirm the receipt of said hearing notice within thirty (30) days or otherwise refuses to participate in the administrative hearing, the hearing officer will proceed to make a final ruling on the PSEBA application based on his investigation and the evidence that the employee chose to submit for the hearing officer's consideration.

§ 32.72: ADMINSTRATIVE COMPOSITION:

The PSEBA administrative hearing shall be comprised of a hearing officer whose power and authority and limitations are as follows:

- A. <u>POWER AND DUTIES OF THE HEARING OFFICER.</u> The hearing officer shall have all of the powers granted to him under common law relative to the conduct of an administrative hearing including the power to:
 - 1. Presiding over all City hearings involving PSEBA.
 - 2. Issuing subpoenas to secure attendance of witnesses and the production of relevant papers or documents upon the request of the parties or their representatives.
 - 3. Inquiring into all matters related to the applicant's entitlement to PSEBA benefits.
 - 4. Regulating all facets of the administrative hearing, including the conduct of any parties and/or their counsel, the length of the hearing and the number of witnesses.
 - 5. Hearing testimony and accepting evidence that is relevant to the issue of eligibility under PSEBA.
 - 6. Ruling on motions to intervene from interested parties
 - 7. Administering oaths.
 - 8. Examining witnesses and directing witnesses to testify
 - 9. Establishing reasonable limits on the frequency and duration of the testimony of any witness.
 - 10. Receiving relevant evidence in the form of testimony, exhibits or stipulations. Insofar as practical, the hearing officer will apply the rules of evidence applicable in Illinois courts. However, the hearing officer is not required to strictly follow the rules of evidence. Testimonial evidence shall be taken only on oath or affirmation.
 - 11. Ruling on objections, motions and questions of procedure.
 - 12. Ruling upon objections in the admissibility of evidence.

- 13. Preserving and authenticating the record of the hearing and all exhibits in evidence introduced at the hearing.
- 14. Haring closing arguments.
- 15. Authorizing the submission of post-hearing briefs and setting the time for their filing.
- 16. Issuing a determination based on the evidence presented at the hearing, the determination of which shall be in writing and shall include a written finding of fact, decision and order.
- B. <u>ESTABLISHMENT OF OFFICE OF HEARING OFFICER.</u> The Hearing Officer shall appointed by the Mayor with the approval of the City Council. Alternate Hearing Officers may serve when the Hearing Officer is not available and may be appointed in the same manner as the Hearing Officer. In making said selection, the mayor shall consider all pertinent information including, at a minimum:
 - The candidate's ability to comply with the job description as set forthherein;
 - 2. Background and performance data made available to the mayor on file with the city or otherwise obtained by the city;
 - 3. The candidate must be an attorney licensed to practice law in the State of Illinois for at least three (3) years and have knowledge of and experience in employment and labor law, general civil procedure, the rules of evidence, and administrative practice.

§ 32.73: ADMINSITRATIVE HEARING:

In the event that an administrative hearing is initiated pursuant to Section § 32.71, the hearing officer shall adjudicate and determine whether the subject public safety employee is eligible for benefits under PSEBA. If the employee is found eligible, the applicant shall be afforded benefits consistent with PSEBA.

- A. <u>TIME AND DATE</u>. Hearings shall be held on the date, time and place as established by the City with appropriate notice served upon the public safety employee as provided in Section 32.71.
- B. <u>RECORD.</u> All hearings shall be attended by a certified court reported and a transcript of all proceedings shall be made by said certified court reported. The City shall be responsible for paying any attendance fees charged by the court reporter; individuals wishing to obtain a transcript of the administrative hearing shall be responsible for paying for their own copy.
- C. <u>PROCEDURES</u>. The City and the applicant shall be entitled to representation by counsel at said hearing and may present witnesses, may present testimony and documents, may cross-examine opposing witnesses, and may request the issuance of subpoenas to compel the appearance of relevant witnesses or the production of relevant documents.
- D. <u>EVIDENCE</u>. The hearing officer shall, where practicable and appropriate, follow (but will not be bound by) rules of evidence which prevail in Illinois court of law.
- E. <u>PREPONDERANCE OF THE EVIDENCE.</u> At the administrative hearing, the employee shall have the obligation to prove that the employee is qualified to receive the benefits by a preponderance of the evidence.

F. <u>FINAL DETERMINATION</u>. The determination by the hearing officer of whether the petitioning public safety employee is eligible for the benefits under PSEBA shall constitute a final determination for the purpose of judicial review under the common law writ of certiorari.

§ 32.72: HEALTH INSURANCE BENEFITS PENDING A FINAL DETERMINATION:

Until a final unappealable administrative or judicial determination of PSEBA eligibility has been made, a public safety employee shall be entitled to maintain his/her prior health insurance as a City employee. However, until a final, unappealable determination of PSEBA eligibility has been made, a public safety employee, or his/her representative, shall be responsible for the prompt payment of all health insurance premiums as thought the public safety employee was not eligible for PSEBA benefits. Should the public safety employee be found to be eligible for PSEBA benefits by virtue of a final, unappealable administrative or judicial determination, the public safety employee, or his/her representative, shall be promptly reimbursed by the City for any out-of-pocket health insurance premiums paid form the date of the employee's catastrophic, PSEBA-related injury death or the date of the Police Pension Board awarded line-of-duty disability pension.

Section 3. Conflicts. Any policy, resolution or ordinance of the City that conflicts with the provision of this ordinance shall be and is hereby repealed to the extent of such conflict.

<u>Section 3. Filing.</u> A Certified Copy of this ordinance, with all referenced attachments, shall be filed with the City Clerk's office of the City of O'Fallon, Illinois.

Section 4. Passage. This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage and approval as provided by law.

List of committees that have reviewed: The Community Development Committee reviewed this application at its April 25, 2016 meeting and recommended approval with a vote of 5-0.

Background

City staff and legal counsel have proposed a number of changes to Chapter 116 to clean up confusing language, create better definitions and create the BYOB (Class "I") License and the Tasting Event (Class "J") License.

The city is proposing to create a Class "I" liquor license which would enable establishments to allow the public to bring and consume their own alcohol at the business (BYOB). This type of BYOB business model is becoming increasingly common as the popularity of art parties/workshops has exploded across the country. Based on the research conducted, staff believes that creating BYOB-specific code language would allow reputable businesses to allow BYOB with some consistent standards, while preventing others from exploiting the lack of regulation to operate under very little oversight or recourse from the City.

The city is proposing to create a Class "J" liquor license. This license would allow applicants to apply for a license that would allow them to offer samples of alcoholic liquor. Typically, these tastings are conducted within package retailers like grocery stores or liquor stores. Such establishments would still need to apply for a package liquor license as they currently do on an annual basis. Currently, the City has no way of approving such tasting events.

Liquor License Fee Schedule: Class "I-1" Annual fee of \$100. Class "I-2" Annual fee of \$25 Class "J" Annual fee of \$100

CITY OF O'FALLON, ILLINOIS ORDINANCE NO. _____, AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 116 ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES OF THE CITY CODE OF ORDINANCES.

WHEREAS, the City of O'Fallon is a Home Rule Unit as defined in Article VII, Section 6(a) of the 1970 Illinois Constitution and has jurisdiction over matter pertaining to its government and affairs; and

WHEREAS, Chapter 116, Alcoholic Beverages, of the City Code of Ordinances governs the licensing of establishments offering alcoholic liquor for sale within the City of O'Fallon; and

WHEREAS, the City Code of Ordinances do not govern or regulate the consumption of alcoholic liquor at places of business within the City of O'Fallon, wherein patrons of the business furnish their own alcoholic liquor, commonly referred to as "bring your own bottle" to be consumed by the business patrons on the business premises; and

WHEREAS, it is in the best interest, health, safety and welfare of the residents of the City of O'Fallon, to govern and regulate the consumption of bring your own alcoholic liquor by business patrons on the business premises.

WHEREAS, there is no provision in Chapter 116 for the application for or issuance of a license for public offering of samples of alcoholic liquor; and

WHEREAS, it is in the best interest of the health, safety and welfare of the citizens of the City of O'Fallon to license such event.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF O'FALLON, ST. CLAIR COUNTY, ILLINOIS AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. The forgoing recitals are incorporated herein as findings of the City Council.

Section 2. Section 116.01 **Definitions**, is amended by way of addition of the following definitions.

Bring Your Own Bottle or BYOB. The practice of allowing patrons of a business inviting public patronage to bring their own alcoholic liquor to be consumed by the patron and his/her guest on the business premises.

<u>Event sponsor</u> shall mean any person who presents, sponsors, hosts, or promotes a tasting event which includes sample tasting of alcoholic liquor whether or not such person directly offers tasting of alcoholic liquor and its related sale at the tasting event.

<u>Package sales</u> shall mean the sale of the same alcoholic liquor which is offered for tasting where such alcoholic liquor is sold in the original container which bears the brewer's and/or manufacturer's label and which is corked, capped, or otherwise securely sealed at the place of brewing, manufacture, or distilling.

Restaurant as defined in §158.016 of the City Code of Ordinances under "Restaurant, Fast-Food" "Restaurant, General" or "Restaurant, Limited."

Tasting shall mean the supervised presentation of samples of one (1) or more varieties of alcoholic liquor to the public served from the original package. Tasting shall be limited to any one individual no more than three (3) offerings in one day of alcoholic liquor in glasses, cups or other containers which are capable of holding no more than one (1) fluid ounce in the case of wine, two (2) fluid ounces in the case of beer, and one-quarter (1/4) ounce in the case of spirits.

<u>Tasting event</u> shall mean any event sponsored, hosted or promoted within the City of O'Fallon primarily for the purpose of offering tasting of alcoholic liquor.

Tasting representative shall mean any person who directly offers tasting of alcoholic liquor to the public and either holds a valid issued retailer's license, special event retailer's license, caterer's retail license or special use permit license issued by the Illinois Liquor Control Commission or works under the direction of, is supervised by, or is employed by a person who holds a valid issued retailer's license, special event retailer's license, caterer's retail license or special use permit license liquor license issued by the Illinois Liquor Control Commission.

Section 3. Section 116.15, **Classification of Licenses**, is amended as follows:

There shall be ten classes of licenses issued by the city to retailers of alcoholic liquor. These classes shall be designed as Class "A" licenses, Class "B" licenses, Class "C-1" licenses, Class "C-2" licenses, Class "D-1" licenses, Class "D-2" licenses, Class "E" licenses, Class "F" licenses, Class "G-1" licenses, and Class "G-2" licenses, and shall be described as follows.

(A) Class "A" On Premise License

- (1) Licenses shall authorize the holder thereof to sell at retail alcoholic liquor for consumption on the premises specified in such license.
- (2) Sales may occur at all hours chosen by the licensee, except between the hours of 1:00 a.m. and 5:00 a.m., when no sales of alcoholic liquor may be made.
- (3) No person may consume, and no person other than the licensee shall possess or have, any alcoholic liquor upon the licensed premises more than one-half hour after the close of business for the retail sale of alcoholic liquor and before such business reopens as allowed by the preceding, and the premises shall be vacated within one-half hour of the close of such business by all persons other than employees of the licensee then engaged in customary after-hours duties which relate to cleaning and closing such business.

(B) Class "B" On Premise Extended Hours License

- (1) Licenses shall authorize the holder thereof to sell at retail alcoholic liquor for consumption on the premises specified in such license.
- (2) Sales may occur at all hours chosen by the licensee, except between the hours of 1:00 a.m. and 5:00 a.m. Monday through Friday, inclusive, and between the hours of 2:00 a.m. and 5:00 a.m. on Saturday and Sunday, when no sales of alcoholic liquor may be made.
- (3) No person may consume, and no person other than the licensee shall possess or have, any alcoholic liquor upon the licensed premises more than one-half hour after close of business for the retail sale of alcoholic liquor and before such business reopens as allowed by the preceding, and the premises shall be vacated within one-half hour of the close of such business by all persons other than employees of the licensee then engaged in customary after-hours duties which relate to cleaning and closing such business.

(C) Class "C-1" Off Premise License

(1) Licenses shall authorize the holder thereof to sell at retail alcoholic liquor in the original retail package of the manufacturer on the premises specified in the license.

- (2) Sales may occur at all hours chosen by the licensee, except between the hours of 1:00 a.m. and 5:00 a.m., when no sales of alcoholic liquor may be made.
- (3) No alcoholic liquor sold pursuant to a Class "C-1" license shall be consumed on the premises for which such license is issued.

(D) Class "C-2" Off Premise Extended Hours License

- (1) Licenses shall authorize the holder thereof to sell at retail alcoholic liquor in the original retail package of the manufacturer on the premises specified in the license
- (2) Sales may occur at all hours chosen by the licensee, except between the hours of 1:00 a.m. and 5:00 a.m. Monday through Friday, inclusive, and between the hours of 2:00 a.m. and 5:00 a.m. on Saturday and Sunday, when no sales of alcoholic liquor may be made.
- (3) No alcoholic liquor sold pursuant to a Class "C-2" license shall be consumed on the premises for which such license is issued.

(E) Class "D-1" On Premise with Entertainment License

- (1) Licenses shall authorize the holder thereof to sell at retail alcoholic liquor for consumption on the premises specified in such license
- (2) Sales may occur at all hours chosen by the holder thereof, except between the hours of 2:00 a.m. and 5:00 a.m., when no sales of alcoholic liquor may be made; provided that, a live band, or such other live entertainment as the Liquor Commissioner deems comparable, performs at such premises at least five days each week.
- (3) No person may consume, and no person other than the licensee shall possess or have, any alcoholic liquor upon the licensed premises more than one-half hour after the close of business for the retail sale of alcoholic liquor and before such business reopens as allowed by the preceding, and the premises shall be vacated one-half hour after the close of such business by all persons other than employees of the licensee then engaged in customary after-hours duties relating to cleaning and closing such business.

(F) Class "D-2" On Premise with Bowling Alley License

- (1) Licenses shall authorize the holder thereof to sell at retail alcoholic liquor for consumption on the premises specified in the license.
- (2) Sales may occur at all hours chosen by the holder thereof, except between the hours of 2:00 a.m. and 5:00 a.m., when no sales of alcoholic liquor may be made, provided that the

holder of such license operates on such same premises a bowling alley and food is being served at all such hours on such premises.

(3) No person may consume, and no person other than the licensee may possess or have, any alcoholic liquor on such premises more than one-half hour after the close of business for the retail sale of alcoholic liquor and before such business reopens as allowed by the preceding.

(G) Class "E" On and Off Premise License

- (1) Licenses shall authorize a holder thereof to make sales at retail of alcoholic liquors for consumption on the premises with a seating capacity for 20 or more patrons and to sell packaged alcoholic liquors for consumption off the premises.
- (2) Class "E" licenses shall authorize a holder thereof to sell, at retail, alcoholic beverages for consumption on the premises specified in such license and to sell packaged alcoholic liquors for consumption off the premises specified in such license at all hours chosen by the licensee except between the hours of 1:00 a.m. and 5:00 a.m. Monday through Friday, inclusive, and between the hours of 2:00 a.m. and 5:00 a.m. on Saturday and Sunday, when no sales of alcoholic beverages may be made.
- (3) No person may consume, and no person other than the licensee shall possess or have, any alcoholic beverage upon the licensed premises more than one-half hour after the close of business for the retail sale of alcoholic beverage and before such business opens as allowed by the preceding, and the premises shall be vacated within one-half hour of the close of such business by all persons other than employees of the licensee then engaged in customary after-hour duties which relate to cleaning and closing of such business.

(H) Class "F" Brew Pub License

(1) Licenses shall authorize a holder thereof to manufacture beer ("brew pub") and store the brew pub at a designated premises and to make sales to distributors, importing distributors, as well as the direct sale to non-licensed consumers for consumption off the designated premises in containers not larger than 64 ounces or on the designated premise. A licensee shall not sell, for off premises consumption, more than 50,000 gallons of beer per year. A Class "F" licensee must have a valid brew pub license from the State of Illinois.

- (2) Class "F" licenses shall authorize a holder thereof to sell, at retail, alcoholic beverages for consumption on the premises specified in such license at all hours chosen by the licensee except between the hours of 1:00 a.m. and 5:00 a.m. Monday through Friday, inclusive, and between the hours of 2:00 a.m. and 5:00 a.m. on Saturday and Sunday, when no sales of alcoholic beverages may be made.
- (3) No person may consume, and no person other than the licensee shall possess or have, any alcoholic beverage upon the licensed premises more than one-half hour after the close of business for the retail sale of alcoholic beverage and before such business opens as allowed by the preceding. The premises shall be vacated within one-half hour of the close of such business by all persons other than employees of the licensee then engaged in customary after-hour duties which relate to cleaning and closing of such business.
- (3) (4) A Class "F" license shall authorize the licensee to sell its micro-brewed beer for consumption off premises in containers not larger than 64 ounces at all hours chosen by the licensee except between the hours of 1:00 a.m. and 5:00 a.m. Monday through Friday, inclusive, and between the hours of 2:00 a.m. and 5:00 a.m. on Saturday and Sunday, when no sales of alcoholic beverages may be made.

(I) Class "G-1" Not-for-Profit License

- (1) Licenses shall authorize a Not-For-Profit Corporation as holder thereof to sell, at retail, alcoholic liquor for consumption only on the premises where sold.
- (2) Alcoholic liquor may be sold at retail for consumption on the premises at all hours chosen by the holder thereof, except between the hours of 1:00 a.m. and 5:00 a.m. when no sales of alcoholic liquor may be made.
- (3) No person may consume, and no person other than the licensee shall possess or have, any alcoholic beverage upon the licensed premises more than one-half hour after the close of business for the retail sale of alcoholic beverage and before such business opens as allowed by the preceding, and the premises shall be vacated within one-half hour of the close of such business by all persons other than employees of the licensee then engaged in customary after-hour duties which relate to cleaning and closing of such business.

(J) Class "G-2" Not-for-Profit Extended Hours License

(1) Licenses shall authorize a Not-For-Profit Corporation as holder thereof to sell, at retail, alcoholic liquor for consumption only on the premises where sold.

- (2) Alcoholic liquor may be sold at retail for consumption on the premises at all hours chosen by the holder thereof, except between the hours of 2:00 a.m. and 5:00 a.m. when no sales of alcoholic liquor may be made; providing that a live band or such other live entertainment, as the Liquor Commissioner deems comparable, performs at such premises at least five days each week.
- (3) No person may consume, and no person other than the licensee shall possess or have, any alcoholic beverage upon the licensed premises more than one-half hour after the close of business for the retail sale of alcoholic beverage and before such business opens as allowed by the preceding, and the premises shall be vacated within one-half hour of the close of such business by all persons other than employees of the licensee then engaged in customary after-hour duties which relate to cleaning and closing of such business.

(K) Class "H-1" Video Gaming License

- (1) Licenses shall be required of each licensee having a video gaming permit issued to the licensee pursuant to Chapter 121 of this code and shall authorize the licensee to sell at retail, alcoholic liquor for consumption, on the premises, specified in the license (2) Sales may occur at all hours chosen by the licensee except between the hours of 1:00 a.m. and 5:00 a.m. Monday through Friday, inclusive, and between the hours of 2:00 a.m. and 5:00 a.m. on Saturday and Sunday when no sales of alcoholic liquor may be made; provided that, a licensee may have a live band, or such other live entertainment as the Liquor Commissioner deems acceptable.
- (3) No person may consume and no person other than the licensee shall possess or have, any alcoholic liquor upon the licensed premises, more than one half hour after close of business for the retail sale of alcoholic liquor and before such business reopens as allowed by the preceding, and the premises shall be vacated within one-half hour of the close of such business by all such persons other than employees of the licensee then engaged in customary after-hour duties which relate to cleaning and closing such business.
- (2) (4) The holder of a Class H-1 license shall not be required to have any other city liquor license.

(L) Class "I-1" BYOB License

(1) Licenses shall authorize BYOB upon the conditions set forth hereafter.

- a. Consumption of the alcoholic liquor must be in conjunction with the purchase of goods and services offered by the business in its normal course of operations.
- b. Consumption of the alcoholic liquor shall be limited to those patrons of the licensee who furnished the alcoholic liquor and their guests.
- c. Every container of wine brought onto the Licensee's premises by a patron may be opened by the personnel of the Licensee and it shall be unlawful for any person to leave the premises with a partially consumed container of wine unless it is securely sealed and receipted by the personnel of the Licensee prior to removal from the premises and placed in a transparent, one time use, tamper proof bag in accordance with the Illinois Liquor Control Act.
- d. It shall be unlawful for any person to leave the Licensee's premises with a partially consumed container of alcoholic liquor other than a properly sealed container of wine.
- e. The Licensee may charge a "corkage fee".
- f. Consumption of alcoholic liquor brought onto the Licensee's premises, by a patron of the Licensee, shall be at all hours chosen by the Licensee, except between the hours of 12:00 am and 5:00 am when consumption of alcoholic liquor is strictly prohibited.
- g. Video gaming shall be prohibited on the premises that possess a Class I-1 license.

 h. Possession and/or consumption of alcoholic liquor by any person under age twenty-one (21) is prohibited.
- i. It shall be unlawful for any business, which does not have either a Class I-1 license or a Class I-2 license, to allow any person to consume alcoholic liquor on the business premises wherein the alcoholic liquor is furnished by a patron of the business.

(M) Class "I-2" BYOB Restaurant Rider License

- (1) Licenses shall authorize a Restaurant that is the holder of a Class A License, B License, E License, F License, G-1 License, G-2 License or H-1 License to permit BYOB upon the conditions set forth hereafter.
 - a. Consumption of alcoholic liquor shall be in conjunction with the purchase and consumption of a meal.

- b. Consumption of the alcoholic liquor shall be limited to those patrons of the licensee who furnished the alcoholic liquor and their guests.
- c. Every container of wine brought onto the Licensee's premises by a patron may be opened by the personnel of the Licensee and it shall be unlawful for any person to leave the premises with a partially consumed container of wine unless it is securely sealed and receipted by the personnel of the Licensee prior to removal from the premises and placed in a transparent, one time use, tamper proof bag in accordance with the Illinois Liquor Control Act.
- d. It shall be unlawful for any person to leave the Licensee's premises with a partially consumed container of alcoholic liquor other than a properly sealed container of wine.
- e. The Licensee may charge a "corkage fee".
- f. Consumption of alcoholic liquor brought onto the Licensee's premises, by a patron of the Licensee, shall be only during the hours as allowed by the Licensee's existing liquor license issued by the City of O'Fallon for the sale of alcoholic liquor.
- g. Possession and/or consumption of alcoholic liquor by any person under age twenty-one (21) is prohibited.
- h. It shall be unlawful for any business, which does not have either a Class I-1 license or a Class I-2 license, to allow any person to consume alcoholic liquor on the business premises wherein the alcoholic liquor is furnished by a patron of the business.

(N) Class "J" Tasting Event License

- (1) Licenses shall authorize a Tasting Event upon the conditions set forth hereafter.
 - a. License shall authorize the holder thereof to conduct alcoholic liquor tasting and sale of packaged alcoholic liquor through a tasting representative in conjunction with a sponsored, hosted or promoted tasting event on days chosen by the Licensee (subject to the restriction hereafter) and at all hours chosen by the licensee between the hours of 9:00 am and 11:00 pm only.
 - b. Any person who applies for a Class "J" license must be a holder of a valid State of Illinois issued retailer's license, special event retailer's license, caterer's retail

license or special use permit license at the time such Class "J" license application is made and at all times during the period of time for which the City license is issued. c. A Class "J" license issued for a tasting event, shall be valid only for and limited to the specific date(s) and hour(s) when the tasting event will occur. The tasting event shall not exceed 5 daily events in a 12 month period of time.

- d. Nothing in this sub-section shall be deemed to relieve any license applicant from the requirement of obtaining a special event permit issued by the City for those events which require such a permit as provided by the O'Fallon Code of Ordinances and/or policies governing the application for and issuance of special event permits.

 e. The license holder shall:
 - i. Prohibit consumption of any alcoholic liquor other than by tasting within the tasting event; and
 - ii. Refrain from offering or providing a sample of alcoholic liquor to anyone under the age of 21 years; and
 - iii. Insure all samples of alcoholic liquor be immediately consumed on the premises of the tasting event; and
 - iv. Prohibit consumption of any packaged liquor sold within the tasting event.

f. Nothing in subsection 4 shall be construed as:

- i. Prohibiting an event sponsor from charging a cover charge to enter the event or from selling tickets for the privilege of participating in the tasting event; or
- ii. Prohibiting an event sponsor from charging any person who purchases any alcoholic liquor product as a package sale; or
- iii. Requiring any event sponsor who offers tasting at a tasting event to also offer package sales of the offered alcoholic liquor at the tasting event.

Section 4. Section 116.18 **Fee** is amended as follows:

- (A) License fees for the sale of alcoholic liquor at retail shall be payable in advance at the time of making application.
- (B) In the event the license applied for is denied, the fee paid with the application shall be returned to the applicant. If the license is granted, the fee shall be deposited in the general corporate fund of the city or in any such other fund as shall have been designated or shall

hereafter be designated by the City Council, by a proper action, and no part thereof shall be refunded under any circumstances.

- (C) License fees shall be as follows, effective May 1, 2015:
- (1) Original application or renewal of a Class "A" or "C-1" license shall be \$400 \$500 per annum (effective May 1, 2015: \$500 per annum)
- (2) Original application or renewal of a Class "B" or "C-2" license shall be \$500 \$600 per annum (effective May 1, 2015: \$600 per annum)
- (3) Original application or renewal of a Class "D-1" or "D-2" license shall be \$600 \$700 per annum (effective May 1, 2015: \$700 per annum)
- (4) Original application or renewal of a Class "E" license shall be \$1,100 per annum
- (5) Original application or renewal of a Class "F" license shall be \$900 per annum
- (6) Original application or renewal of a Class "G-1" license shall be \$400 per annum
- (7) Original application or renewal of a Class "G-2" license shall be \$500 per annum
- (8) Original application or renewal of a Class H-1 license for a for-profit entity shall be \$700 per annum
- (9) Original application or renewal of a <u>Class</u> H-1 license for a not-for-profit entity shall be \$400 per annum
- 10) Original application or renewal of a Class I-1 license shall be \$100 per annum
- 11) Original application or renewal of a Class I-2 license shall be \$25 per annum
- 12) Original application or renewal of a Class J license shall be \$100 per annum

All other provisions of Chapter 116, Alcoholic Beverages, of the City Code of Ordinances, shall remain in full force and effect.

Upon its passage and approval, this Ordinance shall be in full force and effect ten (10) days after its publication in pamphlet form as required by law.

Background

At this time, Chapter 116 of the O'Fallon Code of Ordinances (Alcoholic Beverages) does not make allowances for BYOB (bring your own bottle) type operations. Staff has prepared code language to accommodate these types of requests with a new liquor license. This code amendment is coming to City Council for a 1st reading tonight.

WHEREAS, the applicant has filed an application with the City of O'Fallon, Illinois pursuant to the requirements of all applicable laws, including City Ordinance 3471, "Planned Uses"; and

WHEREAS, the Planning Commission of the City of O'Fallon, Illinois held a public hearing on April 12, 2016, in accordance with state statute, and recommended to approve the petitioner's request to obtain a B-2(P) Planned General Business District zoning for the property with a vote of 6 ayes to 0 nays as outlined in the adopted Planning Commission Report, attached hereto and declared to be an inseparable part hereof (Exhibit A); and

WHEREAS, on April 26, 2016 the Community Development Committee of the City Council reviewed the rezoning and recommended approval with a vote of 5 ayes to 0 nays.

Alcohol will not be sold, but customers will be allowed to bring their own beverages from home and consume them on site while they are participating in classes. Should the tenants at any time want to begin to sell alcohol or allow consumption outdoors, a revised planned use will be required.

On-site consumption will require issuance of a liquor license, pending creation of a "BYOB" liquor license by City Council.

Overview

Lori Lambeth has filed an application requesting a change of zoning from B-2 to B-2(P) for a parcel of land at 300 West State Street. The applicant recently opened an art studio in one of the two commercial tenant spaces and needs planned use approval to allow consumption of alcohol on the site. The applicants will not be selling alcohol, but would like to allow their customers to bring their own alcoholic beverages from home and consume it inside while they are participating in classes.

Zoning & Planned Use

The zoning hearing has been triggered due to §158.116 of the O'Fallon Code of Ordinances which requires planned use approval for "uses offering liquor sales and/or consumption, on- or off-premises." Due to this requirement, the applicant is requesting a change of zoning from B-2, General Business District to B-2(P), Planned General Business District.

The table below summarizes the zoning and land uses of adjacent properties. Please see the attached maps for more detailed information.

North: Adjacent Zoning Adjacent Land Use

North: B-2 & MR-1 Apartment Building

East: B-2 Cincotta Photography

South B-2 & SR-3 (across the tracks) Flooring Fashions & Single Family Homes

West B-2 Gas Station

Comprehensive Plan - Future Land Use

While working on the Downtown O'Fallon Area Action Plan, staff members noticed that a few locations have been miscategorized on the Future Land Use Map in the Comprehensive Plan. In regards to 300 West State Street, the property has two commercial units on the first floor and four residential units on the second floor. It is zoned B-2, however, the Future Land Use Map shows this property as Multi-Family Residential. This is likely a clerical error made at the time of the planning document since the parcel to the north is multi-family. As a follow up to the downtown

O'Fallon Area Plan, staff plans to amend the Future Land Use Map to more accurately reflect the desired uses downtown.

The mapping error mentioned above does not negatively affect Courage and Grace's application. Although the existing B-2 zoning district is not consistent with the Comprehensive Plan, the property can continue to be used commercially. If however, a request is made to rezone to a different category (such as B-1) in the future, the rezoning would have to comply with the Comprehensive Plan at that time.

Liquor Consumption

At this time, Chapter 116 of the O'Fallon Code of Ordinances (Alcoholic Beverages) does not make allowances for BYOB (bring your own bottle) type operations. Staff is preparing code language to accommodate these types of requests with a new liquor license. These code changes do not require review by the Planning Commission, but will be brought to the Community Development Committee and City Council concurrent with this Planned Use application. Hours of operation will restricted by this new liquor license.

Parking

As per Section 158.141, existing buildings in the downtown business district are not required to provide parking if their front door is within 500 feet of a municipal parking lot. 300 West State Street meets this requirement and therefore does not need to provide private parking spaces. However, this property does have access to a few private parking spaces to the west of the building.

Signage

The applicants are not asking for special signage as part of this planned use approval. The sign they requested met city code and was installed with a sign permit issued by the city.

Review and Approval Criteria

Chapter 158, Article 6 of the O'Fallon Code of Ordinances lists several criteria for evaluating planned uses. Evaluation of the project based on these factors is included under each criterion.

1. The criteria governing the rezoning of the property and approval of site plans, as set forth in the standards and requirements found elsewhere in the zoning code or in other applicable law,

The project meets all applicable zoning standards.

The physical design of the proposed plan and the manner in which said design makes adequate provisions
for public services, provides adequate control over vehicular traffic, provides for and protects designated
common open space and park dedication, and furthers the amenities of light, air, recreation and visual
enjoyment.

The proposed reuse of the existing building will not have a significant impact on traffic, nor will it negatively affect open space, light, air, recreation, or visual enjoyment.

3. The relationship and compatibility of the proposed plan to adjacent properties and the surrounding neighborhood.

Reuse of the existing building will not negatively affect adjacent properties.

4. The conformity with the standards and principles of the Comprehensive Plan and all other adopted regulations, including the Commercial Design Handbook dated July 6, 2009 and on file with the City Clerk. (Ord 3665; passed 5-3-10)

As mentioned above, the prosed use is inconsistent with the Comprehensive Plan due to past clerical errors. Even so, the existing zoning in place allows for the proposed use and it is compatible and consistent with the surrounding area. An existing building is not required to comply with the Commercial Design Handbook.

5. The use(s) are designed, located and proposed to be operated so that the public health, safety and welfare will be protected.

The proposed development is designed to be operated to protect the public health, safety and welfare.

6. An identified community need exists for the proposed use.

Yes, a community need exists for the proposed use.

7. The proposed use(s) will not impede the normal and orderly development and improvement of the surrounding property, nor impair the use, enjoyment, or value of neighboring properties.

The development will not impede the normal and orderly development and use of the surrounding property, nor will it impair the use, enjoyment, or value of neighboring properties.

8. The degree of harmony between the architectural quality of the proposed building and the surrounding neighborhood.

The existing building is similar to and will not detract from many of the structures surrounding the property.

9. The appropriateness of the minimum dimensions and areas of lots and yards set forth in the applicable zoning district regulations.

The existing building is similar to many in the downtown area in that it precedes the creation of many of today's zoning requirements and as such, is not required to comply with many of them after the fact.

Public Notice

Public Notice of this project has been fulfilled in accordance with §§158.255 - 158.256 of the O'Fallon Code of Ordinances. More specifically, the applicant has notified property owners within 250 feet of the subject property via certified mail of the filing of the zoning amendment. Additionally, the City has notified property owners within 250 feet of the subject parcel of the public hearing at least 15 days prior to the hearing and published notice of the public hearing in a local newspaper at least 15 days in advance. Proof of notification is on file with the City's Community Development Department.

Staff Recommendation

Staff recommends approval of the project with the following conditions:

- 1) The planned use approval allows for consumption of alcohol inside the building only. Alcohol will not be sold, but customers will be allowed to bring their own beverages from home and consume them on site while they are participating in classes. Should the tenants at any time want to begin to sell alcohol or allow consumption outdoors, a revised planned use will be required.
- 2) On-site consumption will require issuance of a liquor license, pending creation of a "BYOB" liquor license by City Council.







New Business

Item 1. Fire Safety Program – The purpose of the program is to educate businesses and residents on the importance of fire safety. The Fire Department has done approximately 300 visits to businesses within a one year period. These inspections usually take two to three visits per business before approvals are complete; which include current businesses and inspections for new buildings. Chief Saunders said that they are getting positive feedback from the customer survey cards.

Item 2. Intergovernmental Agreement with Fairview Heights to provide Dispatch personnel for Fairview Heights Communications Center — In this agreement Fairview Heights will allow O'Fallon to hire part-time telecommunicators to provide dispatch duties to Fairview Heights. O'Fallon will submit a bill to Fairview Heights to reimburse for the cost of the employee. This contract will be in effect until the agreement with dispatch consolidation is approved. Approximately four to five months.

Action: Request to take to council for a vote to get an approval sign the agreement between City of Fairview Heights and the City of O'Fallon.

Motion: A motion was made by Alderman Kueker to take to council for an approval to sign the Intergovernmental Agreement between the City of O'Fallon and the City of Fairview Heights and seconded by Alderman Hagarty. All ayes.

Item 3. Public Safety Employee Benefits Act – This act will be put in place to give the opportunity for the City of O'Fallon to have a voice when determining eligibility of a disabled employee. Currently the Mayor has assigned Bill Kuzma and Don Murdoch for the O'Fallon Police Department Retirement Board. The board makes the determination of an injury whether it is a non-duty or duty related injury to determine their disability pension. The City will have rule status and will have the opportunity to determine the length of time healthy insurance will be provided.

Action: Request to take to council for a vote to get an approval sign the Public Safety Employee Benefits act.

Motion: A motion was made by Alderman Smallheer to take to council for an approval to sign the Public Safety Employee Benefits Act and seconded by Alderman Roach. All ayes.

Item 4. Chapter 75 Vehicle Conditions, Equipment & Loads — When reviewing the Tow Ordinances we had two major findings. Our program is very effective and we have found that some 65K of fines had ben miss-appropriated. The O'Fallon Police Department has trained other departments in the area on our tow ordinance. They have taken our program and used it in their city as a guideline for use. The negative finding was determined that 65K was miss-appropriated. Some of the funds went to the state of Illinois instead of coming to the City of O'Fallon. Our research led us to find that there is a lack of knowledge of tow ordinance both in the State's attorney office and St. Clair County office. They were pleading down violations when you weren't supposed to or just dismissing them because the companies were providing permits after the fact. These changes will allow the City court to fine them versus county court which will allow us to control the loss of pleading out of the fines. This ordinance allows the City to prosecute tow ordinance violations and outlines the fees per violation.

Action: Request to take to council for a vote to get an approval sign the Chapter 75 Vehicle Conditions, Equipment & Loads to allow the City to prosecute and outline fees for tow violations.

Motion: A motion was made by Alderman Hagarty to take to council for an approval to sign the Chapter 75 Vehicle Conditions, Equipment & Loads and seconded by Alderman Drolet. All ayes.

Item 5. Chapter 77 Traffic Schedule —This ordinance updates the roads and outlines which roads can and can't be used for overweight vehicles.

Executive Summary General Statements:

The City contracted Ballard*King to complete such study.

A Feasibility Study is assessment of proposed project that:

- Objectively and rationally uncover strengths and weakness of a venture.
- Opportunities & threats
- Resources
- Ultimately discover the chance for success

General Statements:

Demographic primary market was City of O'Fallon & Village of

- Shiloh. Secondary service equates to a 20-minute drive time from a central point in the City.
- The median age and median income in the primary service are favorable for an indoor recreation center.
- The median age is lower than the national number and median income is higher. Both point to a high level of participation and ability to pay for services.
- NSGA: National Sporting Goods Association basis for participation statistics.
- Top Four Activities: Walking, Exercising w/equipment, Swimming and aerobic exercising.
- Recreation Department have become a viable option for offering enrichment programs. Many public school settings have eliminated such programs. (arts, daily P.E.)
- Recreation Centers are providers to become feeders private and non-profit programs.
- Trends: Warm-Water Therapy Pools; Zero Depth Entry; Additional Gym Space; Indoor Walking tracks, Senior Space; Preschool/Youth space and programs.
- Significant demand for fitness and wellness with increasing age range for cardio, weight and functional training space for seniors and retirees. People are staying active, longer.
- Market analysis and public input process was completed with a portion of debt recovery and 100% of the operational costs.
- Phased approached for 65,000-75,000 square feet facility, with recommendation of 86,500 total build out for 50,000 primary service area population.
- Annual pass structure is aggressive, but consistent with the goal of capturing 100% of the operating expenses.
- The penetration rate for membership is approximately 5% of the primary service area, and 1% of the secondary service area.
- Non Resident rates are approximately 15% in difference, staff would recommend, 20-25%.
- Market constraints at this time falls short(barely) of the 50,000 number in the primary area while the secondary service area significantly exceeds the number. Primary area does continue to show moderate growth.
- The demographics and participation statistics are such it is the belief an indoor facility would be successful
- The market is not saturated. Components will be key drivers in membership numbers.
- Gymnasium space is currently at a premium.

Research gives us an opportunity to learn and give better understanding of the project.
