It's "Back to School" time and the O'Fallon Police Department would like to remind drivers that citations for **speeding in school zones** carry **heavier penalties** than standard tickets.

625 ILCS 5/11-605


In addition to a **mandatory court appearance**, violations of this Section are punishable with a **minimum** fine of \$150 for the first violation and a **minimum** fine of \$300 for the second or subsequent violation.

For the purpose of this Section, a school day begins at **7:00 AM** and concludes at **4:00 PM**.

When a school bus is traveling on a two-lane roadway and is stopped to pick up or drop off students, the vehicles in all lanes of traffic must stop. Vehicles should stop at least 20 feet before reaching the school bus to allow pupils to cross the roadway safely.

625 ILCS 5/11-1414

"the Secretary of State shall **suspend** for a period of 3 months the driving privileges of any person convicted of a violation..."



O'Fallon PD Special Needs Information Program

As a reminder, the O'Fallon Police Department has a **Special Needs Information Program**. This program is critical to locate someone who has been separated from their families, schools or caretakers. You can self enroll or enroll someone as a caretaker.

Important information for First Responders includes current photographs, physical descriptions, contact information for the individual, and medical information that will help with safety and behavioral concerns regarding the individual. This includes what they are attracted to, where they have been located before, and if they currently use any kind of tracking device.

Once all the information is collected the individual's information will remain confidential and will be secured in the O'Fallon Police Department's database so it can be provided to First Responders when necessary.
