Cavins was sworn in as an O'Fallon Police Officer on August 3, 1990 and attained the ranks of Sergeant, Lieutenant, and Captain during his 29-year career. Cavins is active in the Major Case Squad of Greater St. Louis and holds the rank of Deputy Commander. Captain Cavins' father, Ron Cavins, served as a dispatcher from 1983-2002, and his mother, Joan Cavins, was often referred to as "OPD's biggest fan," since she attended many charitable events and social gatherings and was quick to offer gratitude and encouragement to every OPD member. "It's because of his action that city awards this medal of honor for his heroism," Vetri said as she pinned the medal on Cavins' uniform. Cavins was with KSD radio helicopter pilot Allen Barklage on Friday morning promoting the OFallon Firemen's Picnic when they spotted Bruce Barnes jumping from

the Poplar Street Bridge. Barklage hovered inches above the water and Barnes grabbed onto the units the landing support of the water and Barnes grabbed onto the skid, the landing support of the helicopter. When Barklage raised the helicopter about four feet, Barnes lost his grip. They went down for him a second time and when Barnes second time and when Barnes grabbed the skid. Cavins got out and held onto Barnes arm until nearby barge workers were able to pull him to safety. Sauget Police officer John "Vito" Parisi and St. Louis officer Gerald Harrell alsohelped in the rescue. Barnes, who said he was despondent over his job and personal problems when he decided to jump off the bridge, said he has since changed

bronems when he declade to julip of the bridge, said he has since changed his mind about killing himself. He was hospitalized for only one night and was released June 14. Cavins said he did not expect to be


rewarded for helping to save Barnes life

"It was just out of instinct," he said. "Just a reaction of wanting to help somebody."


