Please take a moment to discuss the following safety tips from SafeKids.org with your children:

- **Cross the street at corners**, using traffic signals and crosswalks. Look left, right and left again when crossing and keep looking as you cross.

- **Put electronic devices down**, keep heads up and walk, don't run, across the street.

- Teach children **to make eye contact with drivers** before crossing in front of them.

- Always walk on sidewalks or paths. If there are no sidewalks, walk facing traffic as far to the left as possible. Children should walk on direct routes with the fewest street crossings.

- Watch for cars that are turning or backing up. Teach children to **never dart out into the street or cross between parked cars**.

- Join kids under age 12 for trickor-treating. If kids are mature enough to be out without supervision, tell them to stick to familiar areas that are well lit and trick-or-treat in groups. <u>Trick-or-Treat</u> hours for the City of O'Fallon are from 6 – 9 p.m. on Thursday, October 31.

The O'Fallon Fire Department will host its annual Halloween safe stop at Engine House # 1 located at **106 East Washington Street.** Traditionally, the safe stop is a huge draw for families living in O'Fallon as well as the neighboring communities. As part of the safe stop, guests tour the station, participate in multiple activities with the volunteer firefighters, and learn about fire prevention. Be safe, be seen. 
