Each year, approximately 3,000 officers carry the Flame of Hope nearly 1,500 miles, running through thousands of Illinois communities via 23 different legs (routes) to raise money and to gain awareness for the athletes who participate in Special Olympics Illinois.

Have you heard about the O'Fallon Fire Rescue Explorer Post?


