Team Illinois Youth Camp

In 2007, the Illinois State Police (ISP) started the **Team Illinois Youth Police Camp (TIYPC)** for youth with the primary purpose of establishing inter-personal relations between at risk youth and law enforcement in order to create a bridge of understanding between the two groups. The first camp began in the East St. Louis area and is still currently held at Principia College in Elsah, Illinois. This year, **O'Fallon Police Captain Mike Mojzis** had the honor of participating as a camp counselor.

The camp is a highly structured week-long residency program and the kids are housed on campus dormitories. The camp, transportation, and activities are provided to kids free of charge. The camp is based on a strict model of discipline and includes para-military drills (formations & marching), physical fitness exercises, and classroom instruction on resisting various societal pressures, dangers of drug & alcohol abuse, hygiene, team building principles, leadership and other life enhancing skills.



Citizen Police Academy Accepting Applications!

The O'Fallon Police Department will be hosting its 10th annual Citizen Police Academy from **Sept 7 – Oct 26, 2022**. The program will be taught by members of the O'Fallon Public Safety Department and guest speakers from other agencies. This academy is open to O'Fallon citizens or persons working in the City of O'Fallon. There will be a tax deductible \$25 course fee to the participants; which will be donated to "The BACKSTOPPERS, Inc."

The Academy is designed to give participants a realistic view of the day to day operations of public safety work by providing instruction, practicals, and education on numerous topics. The Academy will be open to the first 20 qualified applicants, who are 21 years of age or older. **Classes will be held on Wednesday nights (and one Thursday night) from 6 – 9 PM.**

It's "Back to School" time and the O'Fallon Police Department would like to remind drivers that citations for **speeding in school zones** carry **heavier penalties** than standard tickets.


In addition to a **mandatory court appearance**, violations of this Section are punishable with a **minimum fine of \$150** for the first violation and a **minimum fine of \$300** for the second or subsequent violation.

For the purpose of this Section, a school day begins at **7:00 AM** and concludes at **4:00 PM.**

When a school bus is traveling on a two-lane roadway and is stopped to pick up or drop off students, **the vehicles in all lanes of traffic must stop.** Vehicles should stop at least 20 feet before reaching the school bus to allow pupils to cross the roadway safely.




- **LOCK** your cars and roll up windows
