Civilian of the Year – Lead Telecommunicator Brian Bower

Bower serves as a Lead Telecommunicator (LTC) (crew supervisor) in the Metro East Communications Center at the O'Fallon Police Department. LTC Bower is a skilled telecommunicator and has a vast knowledge surrounding the duties and technology within the telecommunications center. Jimmy Ford has been involved in organizing fundraising efforts of well over \$40,000 this past year as well as the donation of a wheelchair accessible bus to a local special olympics team.

The O'Fallon FOP is the gold standard for what every FOP should strive to be. This past year the FOP donated \$105,000 to charitable causes and organizations in the community. We have some Pawesome news to share with you all!!



The O'Fallon Fire Department would like to recognize two major accomplishments within our department. Both fine men have brought great pride to the department. We are honored to call them one of our own.

We would first like to congratulate Ray Flaiz on his retirement! Ray originally was with the department from 1997-1998 but had to depart due to military transfer. He returned to us from 2003-2010 before he again had to transfer. He came back to us in 2017 and is officially retiring in 2024 with 15 years of combined service to our great community.

During his long career as a firefighter, Ray also served on the Hellotis Volunteer FD in Texas, Fosterburg FD in IL, and MidAmerica Crash Fire Rescue & Public Safety.

Ray wore many hats beside a basic firefighter. He also served as an apparatus engineer/driver, recruiter, first aide supply officer, CPR instructor and trustee for the association.
