Dec 14, 2023, there was a press conference at O'Fallon Fire Rescue at Sta 4. Members of IFSA, IL State Fire Marshall along with local Fire Chiefs spoke regarding the new law going into effect Jan 1, 2023.

With the new law, residents will no longer be required to change out the batteries in the new smoke alarms, which will save the average homeowner \$40-\$60 in battery costs. At the end of the 10-year life cycle, the smoke alarm will alert the homeowner to replace the alarm.
