
#### O'Fallon EMS – Stop the Bleed Training

In October, OEMS began a series of classes with teachers, aides, and ancillary staff at in-district schools to train them in the case of a mass casualty event. By the end of the month on and off duty paramedic instructors will have trained over 500 staff members in traditional "stop the bleed" courses.

Stop the bleed is an initiative to provide critical training to lay people in the case of serious bleeding. Like bystander CPR, it provides the public with the knowledge and skills to help prior to EMS arrival. In this course, staff are trained to control bleeding through direct pressure, wound packing, and standard tourniquet application. Students are put through both didactic and hands on training to help them identify life threatening bleeding and take the appropriate steps to manage the injury.

Teachers were trained in both self-application and the application of the combat action tourniquets on single limb injuries as well as hands on wound packing using silicone molds that mimic penetrating wounds. We are excited to continue what we feel is incredibly important training into next month.


