St. Clair County Antenna Agreement – The agreement is to place a microwave antenna on top of the tower on Seven Hills Road. McGrath Consulting Group Audits for EMS & OPD – McGrath Consulting has been performing audits for Police Departments, EMS Departments and Fire Departments. They performed the audit for O'Fallon Fire Department and Chief Saunders was pleased with the information that was provided to him after the audit. They will look at industry standards, perform manpower studies, suggests fleet rotations and other analysis. It has been over 20 years that an audit has been performed in EMS. The hopes are that it

will bring continuity to the Fire, EMS and Police Departments. Cost is \$28,000 to be split between EMS and Police department. Alderman McCoskey suggested that the study show the cost per resident on any changes that may be suggested from the study and to include comparable departments within the state of Illinois.
